WA System – Basics

- Maximum three athletes per country
- Maximum six athletes per relay squad (must include individual 100m or 400m athletes)
- Maximum two teams for mixed RW team event

Events	Qualification Period	Qualification Dates
Marathon	18 months	November 1, 2022 to midnight May 5, 2024
10,000m, 20k RW, Combined Events & Relays	18 months	December 31, 2022 to midnight June 30, 2024
All other events	12 months	July 1, 2023 to midnight June 30, 2024

There will be 25 teams in the Marathon Race Walk Mixed Relay.

There will be 16 teams each for M4x100m, W4x100m, M4x400m, W4x400m, and X4x400m

WA System - Individuals

- Individuals can qualify directly, or by the WA World Rankings system
- WA are looking for about 25% to qualify directly and about 75% through the World Rankings
- As was the case in 2023, for 2024:
Entry Standards and World Ranking Points can only be achieved in WA sanctioned competitions.



WA System – Direct Qualification

- By achieving an **Entry Standard**
- By virtue of **Finishing Position**
 - Top 5 at a **Platinum Label Marathon** within the qualification period.
 - The top 8 from the World Cross Country Ranking not directly qualified through entry standard or World 10,000m Ranking, will be considered as having achieved the entry standard
- **Unqualified athletes (not applicable to Canada)**
 - Countries with no athletes qualified by any other route may enter one athlete.
- In events where the dates allow it, it is possible of counting the 2023 National Championships and 2024 National Championships results, both with category B points



WA System – World Ranking Qualification



June 30, 2024: Deadline for qualifying performances. (**May 5** for Marathon)

July 2, 2024: After accounting for the directly qualified athletes, WA will complete the field for each event using the World Rankings and will publish the official qualification list on their website.

July 6, 2024: Deadline for countries to withdraw any athletes on the WA list.

July 7, 2024: WA will publish a final qualification list (accounting for withdrawals).

July 8, 2024: Deadline for final entries.

WA System – Relays

- **Team**

- For a relay team to qualify it must:
 - Finished in the top 14 at the 2024 WA World Relay Championships OR
 - Be ranked in the top 2 of the remaining nations.

- **Squad members**

- Each relay squad can have up to 6 members.
- No qualifying standard.
- Athletes entered in the individual 100m must be included in the relevant 4x100m squad.
- Athletes entered in the individual 400m must be included in the relevant 4x400m squad OR the Mixed 4x400m squad.
- At the Championships anyone in a nation's team can compete in the relay, the choice is not limited to those formally entered as part of the relay squad.

AC Criteria – Basics

- In general, follows WA system, e.g. AC uses the same:
 - Qualification periods
 - Entry Standards
 - Age groups
- AC add extra **eligibility requirements**.
- Nominations are made by the **National Teams Committee** (NTC)
- There is an **appeals process**, due to the very tight WA deadlines it is a shortened version.
 - Appeals period has been amended to clarify secondary appeals to SDRCC – see revised Criteria for details.
- Final confirmation is done by the **Canadian Olympic Committee** (COC)

AC Criteria – Eligibility Requirements

The full requirements can be found in the Criteria, key elements include:

- Athletes must be on the COC “Long List” and complete all the necessary paperwork. The deadline to complete this is **February 13, 2024**.
- Athletes must **declare** for the event in time (see Criteria for dates).
- Must hold a **Canadian passport** valid until at least February 11, 2024.
- Must be a paid up **member of AC**.
- Must compete in an **AC National Championships** in a related event.
- Must complete required **forms and paperwork**, which may include:
 - Anti-doping awareness eLearning
 - Health Questionnaire (Electronic Pre-Participation Questionnaire)
 - Athlete Agreement
 - Relay Agreement (relay squad members)
- Must comply with the **Team Travel Obligations** unless granted an exception.

AC Criteria – National Teams Committee

Nominations are made by the National Teams Committee (NTC) based on the published Criteria.

AC Criteria – Initial Selection Meetings

- For the Marathon and 10,000m there will be “Initial Selection Meetings” to allow early nominations and give athletes as much time to prepare as possible in these events.
- The Selectors will not “fill” an event in an Initial Selection Meeting, they will leave at least one slot to fill in the Final Selection Meeting.



AC Criteria – Individual Events

- The NTC will only consider **qualified** and **eligible** athletes.
 - “Qualified” means on the list of qualified athletes published by WA on July 2, 2024.
 - “Eligible” means declared, current AC member, etc.

Step 1:

- National Champions will be automatically selected.

Step 2:

- For events with three or less qualified/eligible athletes, everyone will be selected.
- For events with more than three qualified/eligible athletes the NTC will make a “discretionary selections” to fill all of the available slots.

AC Criteria – Discretionary Selections

...For events with more than three qualified/eligible athletes the NTC will rank the athletes **in the order that they consider the athletes are likely to finish at the Olympic Games**. Athletes will be selected in this ranking order until the event quota is full.

- The NTC will take into account ***at least*** the following information, in any order that they see fit:
 - **Best performance** during the Qualifying Period;
 - **Head-to-head results** during the Qualifying Period;
 - Results at the **National Championships** in this event;
 - **Health and fitness** levels that indicate optimal competitive readiness;
 - Competition evidence of the ability to **performance on demand**, preferably in the same event and at this level of competition; and
 - The impact of the likely **competition schedule** for athletes competing in one or more events and/or one or more rounds.

AC Criteria – Relay Events

- The NTC will only consider **qualified teams** and **eligible athletes**.
 - “Qualified teams” means on the list of qualified relay teams published by WA on July 2, 2024 (Top 14 will be confirmed after World Relays in May 2024).
 - “Eligible athletes” means athletes who have declared, are current AC members, have signed the Relay Members Agreement, etc.

Step 1:

- Athletes entered into the individual 100m will be automatically selected for the 4x100m squad.
- Athletes entered into the individual 400m will be automatically selected for at least one of the 4x400m squads (eg W4x400m or Mixed4x400m).

Step 2:

- The Head Coach will recommend the remaining squad members (see next slide).
- The NTC will select based on this recommendation.



AC Criteria – Relay Events

- The Head Coach's recommendation will be based on *at least* the following:
 - **Best performance** during the 2024 season in individual events;
 - **Head-to-head results** during the 2024 season in individual events;
 - Placing at the **National Championships** in his/her individual event.
 - **Health and fitness** levels that indicate optimal competitive readiness.
 - **Commitment to the National Relay Program** as determined by attitude, attendance, participation, and performance at national team camps, competitions, and events.
 - Performance on **previous relay teams**.
 - Assessment of **relay skills** and **position suitability**.
 - The impact of the likely **competition program** for athletes competing in one or more events and/or one or more rounds.

AC Criteria – Appeals

- Selections will be published on AC's website and athletes can appeal decisions to the Commissioners' Office by sending an email to Commissioner@athleticscommissioner.ca accompanied by a fee of \$250 (payable to Athletics Canada). See <https://athletics.ca/about-ac/governance/> for full details.
- Deadlines are specific to each nomination meeting (as outlined in the Criteria). For example - for the Final Selection Meeting
 - July 4, 2024, 12:00pm EST – Deadline to submit appeal to AC Commissioner's Office.
 - July 6, 2024, 12:00pm EST – Deadline for AC Commissioner's operative decision on appeal.
 - July 7, 2024, 12:00am EST – Deadline for submission of secondary appeal to SDRCC.
 - July 8, 2024, 12:00am EST – Deadline for SDRCC operative decision on appeal.
- Successful appeals are normally based on one or more of the following:
 - The NTC based a decision on an error of fact;
 - The NTC did not follow the published Criteria; or
 - The NTC were biased in their decision making process.
- Typically, the fee will be returned for successful appeals.

AC Criteria – Key Messages

- Make sure that you compete in **WA sanctioned events** (see <https://worldathletics.org/competition/calendar-results>)
- Remember to **complete** your COC portal and **declare** on AC's website and do your other paperwork.
- The NTC will select all **qualified** and **eligible** athletes, only making decisions where there are more athletes to select than there are slots to fill.
- The cleanest way to be selected is to qualify, ideally with an Entry Standard, and win the Trials.
- The appeals window is very tight, should you need it.

Personal Coach/IST Policy





Personal Coach (PC) Planning – St. Moritz / Barcelona



- All PCs are encouraged to join the camps.
- Accommodations (double occupancy) in team hotel, meals, and ground transportation will be covered while in St. Moritz / Barcelona for 1 personal coach per athlete.
- PCs are responsible for flights to/from St. Moritz/Barcelona.
- Requests for additional personal coaches need to be submitted to the HPD and Head Coach.
- There is a possibility for Personal IST support for individual CAPP Top 8 athletes – athletes should discuss this with the Head Coach.



Accreditation for Personal Coaches and Personal IST (PISTs) in Paris



- Access to any aspect of the Olympic and Paralympic Games depends on accreditation. How many accreditations we will have in total and when they will “activate” is outside of our control.
- Accreditations will very restricted.
- Access to the athletes’ village will be very restricted.
- We can only accredit people on the Olympic long lists.
- We will try and confirm arrangements as early as possible, but we won’t know our final accreditation allocation until after the Trials, and so some PCs and PISTs will be on a “priority wait list” until the very last minute.
- Because of these restriction most athletes should assume that they will be working with AC’s Team Coaches and Team IST. You should start to familiarize yourself with these staff.



Personal Coaches



- We will only be able to accredit a small number of PCs in Paris.
- Priority will be given to 2022/2023 World Championships medallists, and then 2022/23 top-8 athletes and potential additional (2024) top-8 athletes.
- All accredited PCs must be on the Olympic long list and have appropriate coaching qualifications.
- Most PCs will have to base outside the village.

Personal IST

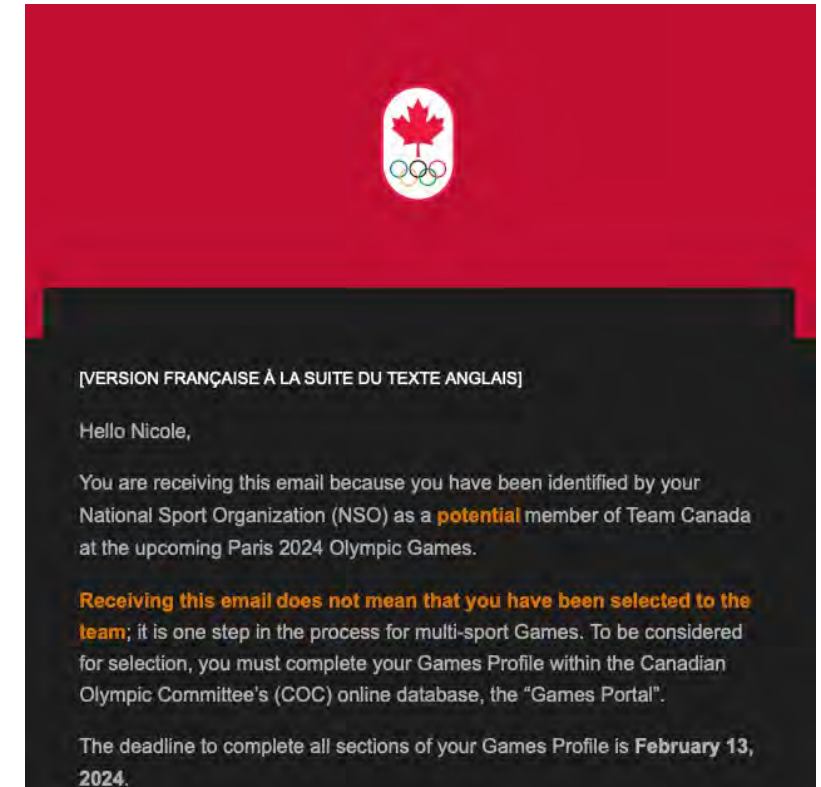
- We will only be able to accredit a very small number of PISTs
- These will be limited to requests from athletes who have achieved one of the following (and even then, we may not be able to cover all requests):
 - Won World Championships medals in 2022 or 2023 (individual medals or relay strike-4)
 - or who finished top 4 at the World Championships in 2022 or 2023 (individual athletes only)
- All accredited PISTs must be on the Olympic long list and have appropriate professional qualifications and insurance to treat in Europe (as determined by COC).
- All PISTs will have to base outside the village.


Olympics Games Paperwork

- The Olympic Games comes with additional administrative requirements compared to the World Championships
- First Step - Complete your Long List Registration in the COC Portal
 - You should have received an email from the COC on January 11th welcoming you to the Portal (please check your junk mail!)



Olympics Games Paperwork

- Within the portal, you need to complete the Accreditation and Outfitting sections
- REMINDER: Your passport must be valid until February 11, 2025.
 - If your passport expires before this date, please renew your passport ASAP.
 - Enter your current passport details and send AC a copy of your new passport once you have received it.
 - The COC cannot enter you in the Paris 2024 system with a passport that expires prior to the above date.

Additional Requirements

- There will be additional COC requirements that are rolled out between now and June – please check your email.
 - COC Athlete Agreement
 - Paris 2024 Conditions of Participation
- In addition, there are AC requirements:
 - Complete your National Team Declaration Form prior to the declaration deadlines
 - Initial Selection for Marathon/10,000m – February 4th
 - Final Declaration for Marathon & Second Selection for 10,000m – May 5th
 - Final Declaration for all other events – June 30th
 - Renew your AC membership via your Provincial Branch
 - You must be a member in order for your results to appear in the rankings
 - Health Questionnaire (ePPQ)
 - If you are a CAPP athlete, you should already have completed this for 2024

General Logistics for 2024

Olympic Games

- Nominations completed July 3rd
- Altitude camp in **St Moritz** opens shortly after Nationals (July 9th)
- Holding camp in San Cugat (**Barcelona**) opens July 23rd
- Recommend 7-10 days in Barcelona
- Transfer to **Paris** minimum 3 nights before event (will account for personal / team coach ties, relay commitments, etc.)
- Leave Paris 48-72hrs after final (depending on flight availability). More on the Paris Period of Stay will be covered in Webinar #2

Reminder: why attend holding camp?

- Physical: Time zones, hot climate, sea-level, dietician managed food, work with full team IST
- Technical: Team coach, comprehensive facilities (most exclusive use or close to exclusive use)
- Mental: Familiar, organized by AC, issues managed by AC, controlled media, teamship
- Financial: Cheaper



Athlete Planning Survey



- In February, AC will launch the Olympic Games Planning Survey for athletes to complete
- Outline your plans for altitude and/or holding camps
- Outline plans for your Personal Coach (if applicable)
- Travel plans (i.e., departure and return airports)

We know that plans can change, but by providing AC with your current plans allows for us to prepare for your arrival at the camps and in Paris.



Sport Technical Reminders

Reminders

- Relay team qualification via the 2024 World Relay Championships (14 of 16 available slots).
- IOC total athlete quota reduced.
- Introduction of “repechage rounds” in many track events.
- As always, accreditation will be much tighter (less numbers) and more complicated. Full details still not published by the IOC.

Olympic Repechage Rounds

- Directly impacts 100mH/110mH, 200m, 400m, 400mH, 800, 1500m
- Traditionally: Three rounds. Around half the field eliminated in first round. Progression from first round by position (Q) or fastest times (q).
- New system: Four rounds. No-one eliminated in first round. Progression from first round entirely based on position, directly to semi-finals or to a new repechage round.
- System will be used for the first time ever at Paris Olympic Games. Exact details remain unpublished.
- More athletes recovering between rounds (no one knocked out in first round).
- Impact on events later in the program:
 - 4x100m, 4x400m relays, anyone attempting mixed and individual 4x400m
 - 800/1500m double or 1500m/5000m double
- “Best effort” rule
- **Careful planning for recovery between rounds**
- **Overall potentially +ve for Canada, *if we plan well.***
